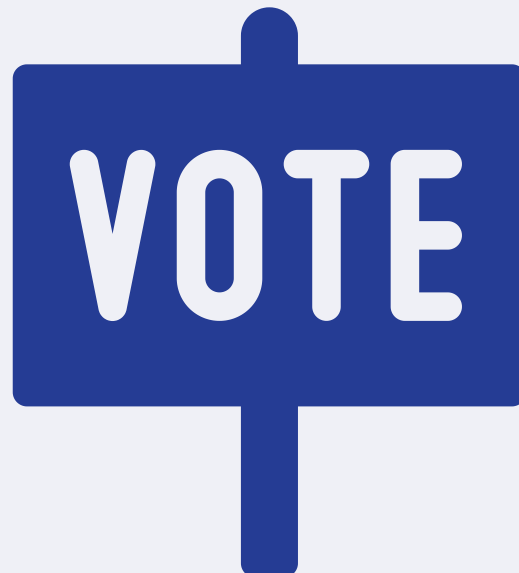
Important Voting Deadlines

October 27

- Online voter registration due 11:59 pm
- Mail postmark voter registration
- In-person voter registration

November 3

- Election Day
- Absentee ballots received by local Town Clerk by close of polls at 8pm

Sample Candidate Questionnaire

Speak up for survivors of domestic violence. Use this question guide to ask political candidates what they would do to support survivors of dv.

- What experience, if any, do you have working with or on behalf of domestic violence victims and their families?
- If elected, what would you do to prevent domestic violence, sexual violence and teen dating abuse
- What changes or alternatives to the criminal legal system would you support (if any) to promote accountability and behavior change with people who commit domestic violence?
- Some population experience the impact of domestic violence differently. How would you engage these communities, and what policies would you pursue to increase safety for each of these populations (immigrant, rural, people with disabilities, BIPOC, etc..)?
- For many domestic violence survivors and their families, stable housing is a barrier to their continued healing. How do you plan to approach the housing crisis in your district?
